



Complete restructuring of the Diet & Nutrition Department

Improving the quality of life of our patients was our core goal.

It has been and continues to be at the centre of our thoughts.

Improving the diet of patients in collaboration with Medical Service and Nutritionist

- Nutrition differentiation according to the detailed instructions of a clinical dietitian - nutritionist with experience in a hospital environment aiming to enhance the nutrition of the patients
- Monitoring of detailed statistical data per patient with systematic recording of weight and other data in order to evaluate and correct nutritional portions
- Creating a digital file of nutrition rules (diet guide)
- Compilation of operation manual for the diet and nutrition department
- Update recipes' handbook based on nutrition value sharing
- Upgrading the daily meal plan
- Creation of an independent Department of Nutrition & Diet with a head kitchen / cookhouse Manager



- Today the department employs two physiatrists and four permanent physiotherapists.
- During 2020, 137 patients in total have been participated in a physiotherapy program on a weekly basis.
- From 2018 until September 2021, 121 patients were put in a wheelchair for the first time.
- Out of the bedridden patients who participated in the physiotherapy programs, 22 of them stood up in 2021 and 10 of them walked, one of whom was discharged to return home, as the goal of his rehabilitation was achieved.





Staffing the Centre of Creative Activities

- A Professor of Classical Theory of Music and Piano was placed as the Head of the Department






REVENUES FROM EOPYY

Revenues from EOPYY have decreased due to the Covid-19 pandemic that disrupted the normal flow of the Foundation's admissions.

GOAL

Operation of a new wing with an extra capability of 40 beds and an annual revenue of € 360,000.

THE EVOLUTION OF EXPENSES



Regarding the expenditures in previous years, we completed the interventions with which we estimate that the operating expenditures will be reduced from the amount of $\leq 7,996,315$ in 2012 to the amount of $\leq 3,914,827$ in 2021.

- In the fiscal year 2020 there was an increase in salary costs as a recognition and reward of employees' efforts.
- There has also been an increase in food costs following the nutritionist's instructions to change the diet of patients, as well as an increase in health equipment costs due to measures against the Covid-19 pandemic.
- At all other levels, expenditure restraint is now a constant policy of the management that is consistently pursued.

RESTRUCTURING OF THE HOSPICE'S REAL ESTATE SERVICE

The Property Directorate has been staffed for 30 years with employees - high school graduates - without any specialization in real estate, as well as in the use of computers. In 2020, in the face of the pandemic, it was impossible to monitor real estate through teleworking. The Management immediately proceeded with the restructuring of the **Property Directorate** with interventions.


RESULTS: 83 NEW RENTALS that will increase revenues (see table "RENTAL INCOME" in the next slide).

- 1. **DEPARTMENT OF DEVELOPMENT** staffed by employees with academic degrees and specialization in management administration, as well as by an IT and database specialist
- 2. **DEPARTMENT OF ARCHIVES** (historical & contemporary) in physical and digital form, staffed by a specialist in the maintenance of archival and book material and by an expert in archival library issues
- 3. **DEPARTMENT OF TECHNICAL SERVICE** staffed by a qualified civil engineer specializing in structural design and a civil engineering technologist. Supervisor of the Department is a qualified civil engineer, member of the Association with many years of experience.
- 4. **DEPARTMENT OF INHERITANCE** which cooperates with the law firm Kyriakidis-Georgopoulos (external partner)
- 5. LEGAL SUPPORT DEPARTMENT with legal staff specializing in real estate issues

RE-ESTABLISHMENT OF THE HOSPICE'S REAL ESTATE SERVICE

The goal for revenue growth is focused on the development and leasing of real estate

RENTAL INCOME



RENTAL INCOME:

- *2019 Reduction of income due to real estate sales and inactive rent
- **2020 Reduction of revenues due to the Covid-19 pandemic (affected companies and individuals)
- 2021 Increase in rental income compared to 2020 of an estimated amount of € 133,832
- 2022 An increase in revenues from lease agreements is estimated in relation to 2021, amounting to € 191,000.

Important actions in progress:

- The clear-out of 59 legacies from the 304 pending files since 1980 in the Decentralized Directorate of Attica, Thessaly, Epirus, Aegean and the Ministry of Finance
- Focus on transparency and growth through the leasing of all vacant properties

Completed important actions:

In 2008, 507 of the 547 properties owned by the Hospice were declared to the National Land Registry by the Property Directorate within the Municipality of Athens and all statements were rejected. In 2020, with the preparation of 547 technical reports as well as with the required legal control, the result was the securing of all the properties owned by the Hospice i.e. 547 properties in the Municipality of Athens.

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Approval of the amendment of statutes in order to modernize and enhance transparency

- We made modifications that incorporate modern needs such as the possibility of teleconferencing, etc.
- We expanded the means of achieving the purpose of the Association by incorporating actions such as:
- ✓ Participation in European programs,
- ✓ Operation of support units and development of service infrastructure such as: (i) Center for Rehabilitation and Recovery of Open Hospital Treatment, (ii) Center for Rehabilitation and Recovery of of Closed Hospital Treatment, (iii) One-day and two-days Care Centre, (iv) Supported Living Accommodation and (v) Autonomous Living Accommodation, etc.
- Establishment of an Ethics Council



Completion or plan of important legal issues

 Significant pending legal issues have been resolved or are in the process of being finalized.

The following are mentioned:

- ✓ The completion and full repayment of the difference due to the heritage of Nikolaos Spentzas family
- ✓ The exemption of the members of the Board of Directors for debts to insurance funds
- ✓ The appeals for cancellation of ENFIA charges
- ✓ Prosperity through legal actions and decisions for collection of owed payments amounting to € 668,854
- ✓ Successful final settlement of most labor disputes (justification of the Foundation and the Hospice), as well as compliance of the Foundation and the Hospice with the relevant requirements of labor law and court decisions



Approval and Adoption of a new modern organization chart for the Hospice and the Foundation

- A separate organization chart was prepared, approved and implemented for the Hospice and the Foundation based on which the responsibilities and the hierarchy for the implementation of the projects have been established:
 - The organization chart is implemented through detailed job descriptions that have already been implemented for the Hospice while for the Foundation are in the final stages of processing.
 - Detailed manuals of procedures for all departments (indicative: supplies, Hospice's and Foundation accounting, real estate operation, etc.) are in the final stage of processing, which are to be submitted for audit from the Legal Service of the Hospice and the Foundation in order to be submitted for approval by the Board of the Hospice and the Foundation.
- The organization chart is now a critical tool for management and performance.
- After the approval of the new statute, a modern operating regulation is in the process of being drafted.



Creation and staffing of an independent Internal Control Department

- The creation and staffing of the independent Internal Control Department is an important step for the organizational integration.
- The Department was staffed by an experienced auditor, a member of the Body of Certified Public Accountants with many years of experience in a multinational environment.
- The Department operates with independence requirements as required by applied international internal auditing standards.
- The Department's responsibilities are to perform internal audits in all operational areas, to compile a detailed operating manual and jobs and to update the operating regulations. The drafting and updating of regulations is in the final stage of implementation.



Renovation of Giaglopouleio Wing

Within 2018, the construction works, and part of the E/M works of the renovation were completed. When put into operation, the new wing will be able to accommodate 40 patients, according to current standards for disabled people.

The total budget of the project is estimated at € 450,000 and is implemented mainly through sponsorship programs.

Receipt of Equipment & Sanitary Material

We received hospital equipment, sanitary material and consumables from the international organization Project Cure through the mediation of the humanitarian organization Life line Hellas.

We received 40 special electric ICU beds. The total estimated value is \$ 1,050,000.


Expansion of the Department of Rehabilitation & Physiotherapy

It now covers an area of 103m² and remains open every day, except Sunday.



Installation of a Photovoltaic Station

With the agreement from 22/11/2019 with the Hellenic Petroleum company as part of its corporate social responsibility, we secured free installation of a photovoltaic system of self-generation with 100kwp energy offset of an estimated value of € 80,000.

The installation was successfully completed in early 2020 and its results are already visible and measurable. An average self-production has been achieved at a rate estimated at 50% while the energy costs of the Foundation have been reduced by an average of 25% (energy cost comparison 2018-2021) or an absolute size of € 15,000 on an annual basis.

Upgrading of 2 boiler rooms


In September 2018, SYN ENOSIS undertook the modernization works of the two boiler rooms of the hospital.

The project has been completed improving the efficiency of the system, while saving significant resources. The total value of the project is estimated at € 108,000.

Other activities for infrastructure improvement

- Pre-approval of the license of the Hospital (which has been operating without a license since 1976) and its conversion into a rehabilitation & recovery center for closed & day care hospitalization and construction of supported living roofs
- Establishing permanent & stable collaborations with institutions & sponsors for the needs of the Foundation for Care of Neurological Illnesses & the Hospice
- Discussions regarding the study for the rescue and repair of the historic villa, due to its unique historic value and identity, in collaboration with the Chairman of the Board of the Municipality of Athens
- Study for the digitization of our historic archive of collections and museum material in collaboration with the Municipality of Athens, the Ministry of Culture, the National Technical University of Athens and the University of West Attica
- Study for our inclusion in NSRF programs
- Monitoring coordination for the updated website of the Hospice
- Reactivation of the volunteer department (update of availability / preparation of presentation / writing of volunteer form / presentation)
- Upgrading the infrastructure with 10 dehumidifiers, 23 air conditioners, piano, 60 chairs and 140 mattresses cases (with an estimated cost of € 10,000 by donation for the mattresses cases)
- Maintenance of the new ICU beds (donation of € 33,500)


The first summer swim of the patients at PIKPA Voula

- Following the visit, a special video was created to promote the initiative on Social Media.











When, for my own personal professional reasons, I first walked through the door of the Hospice for Neuro-disability in 2007, had no idea how central it would become to my life in the years to come. Second only to my own family, the Hospice would become the main recipient of my love and care.

In 2012, I was elected to President the Board of the Hospice for Neurodisability. There were battles large and small to keep the institution running after 124 years of service. The entire Board and staff were working to improve our patients' quality of life and doing everything in our power to spark a moment's joy and optimism, to give a ray of hope.

For many patients, our nurses, doctors and administrative staff are all they have in the world. I have found a simple way of dealing with life's daily challenges: taking time for a walk around our hospital, for a hug with Vaso, Eleni and Michalis; a tender exchange with Vaggelis, Ilias and so many others whose most profound need is for human contact. Moments great and small that give me the strength to keep on fighting the good fight, continuing the constant uphill struggle that's been going on for 124 years with solidarity as my only guide.

The Hospice has vanquished time or, rather, it has withstood it.

It has charted its own course.

There are some significant things that keep the Hospice alive; it has roots, it has shaped consciences, it believes in values, it embodies the visions of generations of Greeks. Its fate bound up with that of Greece itself and of Greek society. The Hospice has faced and survived darker days than the present crisis. It is not afraid because it knows—as all of us here know—because we live it on a daily basis: real strength stems from the soul, not the body!


The Hospice is a public benefit, not-for-profit charitable organization which exists solely to serve its philanthropic goals. Since 1893, its specially-trained staff (doctors and nurses) have provided full medical and nursing care to thousands of patients with chronic conditions but no personal funds, along with financial assistance. The Hospice has also relieved families of the heavy burden of caring for their loved ones at home. It is managed by an 11-member Board of Directors and operates as a legal entity governed by Private Law. Its financial resources stem exclusively from the rental and leasing of Hospice-owned property and contributions from supportive individuals, institutions, companies and societies.

It operates without government funding of any sort.

In 1972, in order to achieve the goals for which it was established, the Hospice for Neuro-disability established the Foundation for Care of Neurological Illnesses.

Today, the Foundation cares for around 180 patients from every part of Greece. Paraplegic or tetraplegic, stroke victims or suffering from multiple sclerosis or other conditions of the central nervous system, all face mobility issues. A full 80% of our patients are bedbound and incontinent. The Hospice for Neuro-disability takes in people whose incurable illnesses render them incapable of looking after themselves. Our only condition for entry is that an individual is not suffering from a psychiatric or infectious illness, has hard-toheal wounds, acute conditions or a cancer which requires special treatment. Our patients remain in the Foundation until the end of their lives; generally, they require increased medical, nursing and pharmaceutical care during these final stages.

A staff of 110 (doctors, physiotherapists, nurses, occupational therapists, administrative staff, technicians, handymen and others) provide them with 24-hour support.

The 110 everyday heroes of the Hospice for Neuro-disability

The medical care is provided by six salaried doctors with the help of specialists including an ophthalmologist, a dermatologist, an orthopaedic specialist and a neurologist-psychiatrist.

Our patients' dental needs are provided for by a fully-equipped dental surgery within the Foundation, which is manned by a salaried dentist. The Foundation also has its own physiotherapy department in which two qualified physiotherapists provide their services.

The full range of microbiological examinations are carried out in a microbiological laboratory which has contracted to cover all our patients' requirements in this area.

The nursing and care staff consists of 3 nurses with a four-year nursing qualification, 16 qualified nursing assistants with a two-year qualification and 30 assistant nurses.

We do everything we can to ensure that our patients are clean and that their needs are catered for. A total of 15 kitchen staff provide their services in the Foundation, along with the Volunteer Sisters of the Hellenic Red Cross and Friends of the Hospice who volunteer to help clients who cannot eat unassisted. The 40 or so private nurses who accompany the patients also provide significant assistance with their care.

Our patients' diet is overseen by a special committee. The food is subject to checks by the doctors and samples are periodically sent for chemical analysis. Since March 2014, we have enjoyed the support of the Mission of the Sacred Archdiocese of Athens, which provides our patients with their mid-day meal.

Hospice for Neuro-disability: Philanthropy in practice since 1893

The Hospice for Neuro-disability was founded in 1893, 60 years after the creation of the modern Greek state. Wealthy and educated citizens, members of Athens' great families, joined forces with simple, everyday folk in the first organized and institutionalized act of social philanthropy in Greece.

All together, they helped cover the Foundation's operational needs but also helped it to grow. As a result, the Hospice for Neuro-disability remains Greece's largest charitable organization.

The history of the Hospice for Neuro-disability in numbers



The historic home of the Hospice for Neuro-disability: Admiral Malcolm's villa

The historic villa was built in 1831 by the British admiral and philhellene Sir Pulteney Malcolm, who succeeded Admiral Codrigton as commander of the British Mediterranean fleet. It was designed by the architects Stamatios Kleanthis and Eduard Schaubert. The building was later home to the Russian ambassador Alexandr Ozerof and subsequently to Ambassador Piscatory of France. The villa then passed into the possession first of the Duchess of Plaisance, Sophie Lebrun, and later Prime Minister Spyridon Trikoupis, whose son Charilaos sold it to Rodokanakis, the art lover from Syros. The Hospice for Neuro-disability leased the property in 1901, purchasing it four years later in 1905. It has been our permanent home ever since.

A later extension in the grounds of the villa was made possible by donations, which allowed the Hospice to increase its number of beds.

In 1973, a dispensing chemist, library, microbiological lab, neurological surgery, physiotherapy room, dental surgery, common room,occupational therapy room, laundry, machinery storage room, kitchen, Friends' Lounge, dressing room for external staff and a small chapel were added to the Hospice's facilities.

The Hospice for Neuro-disability was declared an historic and artistic building by dint of Act 46/19.12.72 of the Archaeological Council. As such, it—like the German Archaeological School, the Marasleio Academy, the mansions lining Athens' pedestrian walkway, the Stathatos Mansion and another eleven buildings and churches in Athens—warrants special state protection as an at risk example of the architecture and principles of the past.

Maturing along with Greece

The Hospice for Neuro-disability matured in parallel with the new Greek capital.

It survived the same trials and tribulations and continued to serve Greek society during the Balkan Wars, the Great War, the Asia Minor Campaign, World War Two and the Greek Civil War.

Over the last 40 years, the Hospice for Neuro-disability has had to fight for its life. Although the public has continued to demonstrate the high regard in which it holds us by supporting our efforts with donations and bequests of property, this very generosity has left us struggling against an unbearable taxation burden. Still, given the crucial needs the Hospice serves and our waiting list, which has rarely been as long as it is today, we have a duty to continue serving the community.




